## END OF YEAR TROPHY COMPETITION

As entries to this competition are usually brought into tonight's meeting, this information on the end-of-year trophy competition should have been included in last month's edition of Shutterbugs. However, for those members who did not receive Gaynor's email regarding bringing them tonight and wish to enter, you have until tomorrow week (Cup Day) to get your entries to either Peter Brady (9885 6092) or Vicky Hyduke (9836 9319). Please ring the appropriate number and arrange a delivery time. There are seven competitions in Prints and Projected Images covering a number of open and specialised subjects. A maximum of two entries are permitted in each competition. These are listed in the 2008 Syllabus but for those who have lost this document they are:

**The Wilfred Broadhead Memorial Trophy:** For the best **Projected Image**. Subject Open.

**The Viola Boice Memorial Trophy:** For best **Landscape Projected Image**.

**The Gordon Hankin Memorial Trophy;** For best **Large Print**. Subject Open.

**The George Rosedale Memorial Trophy:** For best **Large Architectural Print**.

**The Nell and Viv Bennett Perpetual Trophy:** for best **Colour Print of Flora plus**. (See By-laws for details)

**The Monochrome Print Perpetual Trophy:** Subject Open.

**The Barbara Symonds Memorial Trophy:** For best **Small Print**. Subject Open.

Full details of these competitions with subject definitions are contained in the Club By-laws, a copy of which, with a submission form, can be found as an insert in this newsletter.

The term “Projected Images” refers to both Slides and Digital Images. Members can submit two entries in each category, ie, two Slides, two Digital Images or one of each. Digital images must conform to the Clubs requirements. (No greater than 1024 pixels wide by 768 pixels high and a maximum jpeg file size of 220KB)

All digital image entries to be submitted on the one CD with separate folders for each category. Each folder to be titled with your club number and the category initials. ie, “999WB” for Club No 999 and category Wilfred Broadhead. The file for each entry must be titled with your club number and a short title. ie, (999RedHat)

## Digital Jottings

### FILE FORMATS

Photographers often refer to various file formats in ways that can be very confusing for someone starting out in photography. It usually starts out in reference to the particular camera that they use. Some cameras record only in JPEG format which is fine as this is the format that is suitable for printing in any camera store. So what's all the fuss?

Well some other cameras record in both JPEG and RAW formats and RAW files bring with them some added complications or more correctly, all cameras produce RAW files but not all of them are accessible. When you make an exposure the imaging chip – whether CCD or CMOS – produces a voltage proportional to the intensity of light falling on each pixel. The camera's circuitry converts the analog signal to either 12 or 14 bits of data. If the camera records 12 bits of data then each pixel can produce  $2^{12}$  or 4096 brightness levels while a 14 bit processor can produce  $2^{14}$  or 16384 different brightness levels. Some cameras allow you to record both the RAW file and a JPEG file which is derived from the data. These are recorded on the memory card.

I hear you saying "But my camera doesn't produce anything called a RAW file!" The reason for this is that the various camera manufacturers have not agreed on a standard format for their original data files and hence the RAW file from each manufacturer has its own peculiar file extension.

This also means that each camera must come with software which can open your cameras RAW files and/or you have to have a third party program eg, *Photoshop*, *Phase One*, *Paint Shop Pro*, etc, which can open all files with these extensions. This type of software is called a *RAW converter*.

RAW files are frequently referred to as *digital negatives* as they contain the minimally processed data produced by the imaging chip and they can be manipulated to produce the result required by the photographer. Raw image files cannot be reproduced as such but can be fine tuned and converted to another file format for printing where the maximum amount of information is retained. The file format used for printing the image is usually .tiff format.

As a large amount of data is produced and stored in RAW format the file size is many times greater a JPEG file. You can fit fewer images onto a memory card and fewer pictures can be taken in succession as they take longer to store. In part, this can be offset by using faster memory cards with greater capacity.

It seems that there are many disadvantages with using RAW files but these must be seen in light of what happens in the conversion of RAW files to JPEG files. The JPEG format records in 8 bit mode which will give 256 brightness levels while digital cameras commonly produce data in 12 or 14 bit mode. This means that in the conversion the data is reduced from at least 4096 to 256 brightness levels. So the file size is reduced but the amount of data available for reproduction is also substantially reduced. The size of the reduction is further increased by compression.

Each time you open and resave a JPEG file, it degrades in quality. The amount of degradation is directly related to the amount of compression, so the greater the amount of compression, the worse it will look. This degradation will take the form of greater pixilation and a convergence to graying of the image.

All in all you are better to store your image files in a RAW format as you retain all the image information. In addition this format will contain a header file which will contain camera settings, date, white balance etc. This means that your files will be safe for many years if you store your files on an archival disc.
