

MACRO PHOTOGRAPHY OUTING GETTING DOWN AND DIRTY!

On Sunday, 2nd October, armed with our cameras, tripods, ground sheets and an application of mosquito repellent, eleven of us explored the Maranoa Gardens in Balwyn. Being Spring there were plenty of macro shots to be taken of the Australian natives from all over Australia.

The garden was originally established in 1901 as a private garden. In 1922 the Camberwell Council purchased it and in the meantime has more than doubled its size to the 35 acres it is today. With 5000 plants it's worth visiting multiple times over the year to appreciate the different flowers over the seasons. The garden is recommended should you be planning a new garden and needing inspiration. Your camera can then record the plants and their name tags for future reference.

Being Spring there were many varieties of flowers to practise our macrophotography. We also looked for patterns and textures within the flowers, their foliage and on tree bark. Several of us brought a spray bottle of water to help accentuate the more subtle colours on some barks, (especially snow gums)

For those with a mathematical bent, there's always a macrophotographic challenge in looking for examples of Fibonacci numbers found in nature eg the branching in trees, the arrangement of leaves on a stem, the fruit sprouts of a pineapple, the flowers of the protea family, the uncurling of ferns and the arrangement of a pine cone. A tip for a light weight ground sheet that takes up negligible space when traveling, is to get an old umbrella and cut away the ties on the spokes, leaving the nylon fabric for you to kneel on or cover your camera/ your head should it rain.

DIGITAL JOTTINGS - OCTOBER 2011

One of the most difficult things to photograph has to be a work of art, such as a sketch, a sculpture or a building. The photographic techniques are straight forward enough but the arguments surrounding the copyright requirements can be long and complex. Normally we are told that the photographer who pushes the shutter - release holds the copyright. This is true for a landscape or a nature photograph but in the case of a work of art you also have to be aware that the artist holds the copyright to the subject and this presents a situation that needs resolution.

A photograph of say a sculpture could be either an "exact" copy or it could be the photographer's interpretation of the artist's work. The first case could require a release from the artist and the question to consider is "does the photographer's image add to or detract from the sculpture. The second case requires much more input from the photographer as an interpretation is required. Before you activate the pixels consider the sculpture - what does it say to you? Or what do you see in it that is your unique point of view? It is important that photographers inject something of themselves into their work. This is where photographs say something to their viewers.

It could be that the whole area of copyright will change in the near future as the British Prime Minister has commissioned a report into the system and the report has been tabled (HYPERLINK "<http://www.ipo.gov.uk/preview.htm>" www.ipo.gov.uk/preview.htm). It could be that in the future to gain copyright an image will have to be registered with a centralised body termed the Digital Copyright Exchange. This may require more effort to secure copyright but carry with it more certainty.

Dr. David Pitt died on Wednesday 5th October after a brief illness at the age of 95. David joined the Camera Club in 1979 and played a significant part in the club's activities over more than 25 years, joining the committee in 1981 and subsequently served as Syllabus Convener from 1984 - 1989, also as Vice President from 1987 - 1989 including Club Host in 1989. He was Slide Group Convener in 1999 and entered competitions for many years, winning the Wilfred Broadhead Trophy on three occasions and the Barbara Symonds in 1999.

David had a great interest in audio-visuals and with his wife Marjorie played host to our meetings for several years and was heavily involved in their preparation including script writing.

Some of his photographs adorn the walls of the residential in Lisson Grove where he spent his last years. He launched another book of his poems at the Kew Library earlier this year and was pleased to have his own AV's of his travels converted to digital a few months ago.


